What are apprenticeships?

Modern apprenticeships allow people to gain practical on-the-job experience whilst studying for a recognised qualification in a related discipline at the same time. You are employed as an apprentice, and will receive a salary meaning you can effectively 'learn while you earn'. You can do apprenticeships now in all kinds of professions, and you can even study for degrees as an apprentice instead of going to university.

What apprenticeships can you do at LSH?

The main apprenticeship routes we offer into our industry are the surveying degree apprenticeships which involve studying a part-time BSc or MSc degree in the following subjects:









Real Construction Project Estate Management Building Surveying Quantity Surveying

In all cases the apprenticeship includes the degree course which then leads onto the APC assessment to become a Chartered Surveyor. Most our surveying apprenticeships are delivered by the UCEM who offer a distance learning course. There may be other University options depending on location of the role.

How do they work?

As an apprentice you will typically work for 4 days a week and have 1 day per week given to you for off the job (OTJ) learning, which in this case will mainly be for your degree studies and later for your APC. This day can be flexible in agreement with your manager and will last for the duration of your apprenticeship.

You will need to do plenty of study in your own time but as part of your apprenticeship agreement, we have to allow you an average of 6 hours per week for OTJ learning and you will need to log these hours.

What qualifications do I need for a Surveying degree apprenticeship?

BSc Apprenticeship

UCEM currently require a minimum of 96 UCAS points which is the equivalent of 3 x C grades at A-Levels (or equivalent qualification). Other universities may vary.

MSc Apprenticeship

This course requires you to have an undergraduate degree in a different subject.

Other apprenticeships available at LSH:

We also have apprentices in our group functions working towards qualifications in their fields such as:

Marketing, Technology, HR, Finance/Accounts, Admin support

Every apprenticeship course differs in its duration and cost.

When can I apply?

We only recruit apprentices on ad-hoc basis when vacancies arise. We do not have a set application period each year.

Anyone interested applying should regularly check the LSH careers website for vacancies, or submit their CV and a brief cover note stating their interest and location (office) to earlycareers@lsh.co.uk and we hold their details for 12 months in anticipation of any matching vacancies arising.
